

# **Georgia Military College and Oglethorpe University Transfer Articulation Agreement**

## **Introduction**

This document serves as a formal agreement between Georgia Military College and Oglethorpe University. The agreement serves to facilitate a student's ability to transfer select coursework without jeopardizing the intended mission and stated goals of any participating entity. All conditions of the agreement must be met before a student may apply for credit at Oglethorpe University.

## **Agreement on Communication**

Both institutions agree to cooperate in communicating with each other concerning this articulation agreement. Communications may include common publications and announcements concerning their affiliation. Both institutions will encourage the dissemination of information about programs in this agreement with interested and qualified students, with both agencies providing advising and counseling to prospective students.

## **Agreement of Admission**

The student must apply for admission and be admitted to Oglethorpe University's traditional undergraduate program in order to apply for articulated credit as outlined in this agreement. A student who has completed 36 or more quarter hours (24 semester hours) and has a minimum cumulative 2.5 GPA for all academic work *attempted* at Georgia Military College or other regionally accredited institutions will be admitted to Oglethorpe University.

Oglethorpe University may deny admission only if coursework falls below minimum admission standards or applicants are not in good standing.

Admission to Oglethorpe University does not guarantee admission to specific majors or programs. Students must meet minimum admission requirements specific to select majors or programs to be considered for admission into such majors or programs. Students who have not completed pre-requisites for admission to specific majors will be required to complete the pre-requisites at Oglethorpe University.

## **Agreement on Articulated Courses**

This agreement ensures transferability of selected courses from Georgia Military College to Oglethorpe University. A student having earned a grade of "C" or better in a course identified in the attached matrix from Georgia Military College is ensured that course will transfer as indicated. Transfer credit will not be granted for sub 100 level coursework. Additional credits may be accepted after evaluation if the courses meet other program requirements or to satisfy elective credits.

There is no limit to the number of credit hours a student may transfer to Oglethorpe University, however a minimum of 32 semester hours and 50% of coursework for the student's chosen major must be completed at Oglethorpe University. All program requirements must be met before a student can earn an Oglethorpe degree.

Oglethorpe has a unique general education program, the Core curriculum. Each student's transcript is evaluated course-by-course for Core equivalencies. An added benefit for students who have completed an Associate of Science degree or Associate of Arts degree at Georgia Military College is that they will be granted transfer course equivalencies for all 100 and 200-level Core courses, regardless of whether they have successfully completed the specific course equivalent. All upper level Core courses must be completed in residence at Oglethorpe University.

Students who complete an Associate degree at Georgia Military College and receive a grade below "C" in any courses required for the Associate degree will still not be required to complete any 100 and 200-level Core courses, but individual course equivalencies will not be granted.

Oglethorpe University will make every effort to audit incoming transfer records to grant transfer course credit, however, it is the student's responsibility to contact the office of the university registrar to ensure proper course equivalencies are granted.

This agreement replaces any former agreements and applies to all courses in the attached matrix.

### **Agreement on Maintenance and Review**

The registrar at Oglethorpe University and Georgia Military College will be appointed to act as a primary point of contact for the agreement, to speak for the institution, and to communicate details and modifications to respective faculty, administrators, and advisors at the institutions involved. This agreement will be in effect from the date of administrative endorsement. Either party may elect to terminate this agreement by sending a written statement to the other party with at least one term prior notice of the cancellation.




